The Huntington Garden Club has enjoyed planning your visit. Now we are looking forward to getting to know you and sharing some of the exciting things happening in our community, old and new.

Your first night will be in our \$22.6 million expansion of the Virginia Living Museum. It is a soaring expanse of glass and open space set in over 25 acres of native plantings, animal habitat and exhibits, all traversed by a half-mile of elevated boardwalk. All of the exhibits are indigenous to the state of Virginia. The Backyard Habitat, made possible by a Common Wealth Award, is one of our more popular attractions. Wednesday morning, we will be fortunate to hear a talk on Historic Gardens by William Seale. We have included information about Dr. Seale's numerous accomplishments in your bag.

Lunch will be held at Tazewell Hall, the home of Mr. & Mrs. John R. Lawson, II. Tazewell Hall was built in Williamsburg in 1762 by John Randolph. In 1954, a Randolph descendant bought the home from the Colonial Williamsburg Foundation and moved it to its' present, lovely location on the James River. Thomas Jefferson and George Washington once strode these hard pine floors. It is a treasure full of treasures, rich in history.

After lunch, you will visit The Mariners' Museum, one of the biggest private urban parks in the United States. It is a sanctuary for wildlife and birds, a botanical preserve and one of the largest maritime museums in the world. This is the site of the restoration of the Monitor.

Our Banquet will be in the Ferguson Center for the Arts at Christopher Newport University. The building was designed by I.M. Pei, also the designer of the expansion of the Louvre in Paris, the East Wing of the National Gallery of Art in Washington and the John F. Kennedy Museum in Boston. It is a new cultural beacon in the Commonwealth, attracting world class performers.

Directions to the Virginia Living Museum 524 J. Clyde Morris Blvd. (757) 595-1900 • 1 Mile

Exiting the Omni Hotel take a left onto Diligence. At the Diligence stop light, you will take a right onto US 17S/J. Clyde Morris Blvd. towards Newport News. Crossing Jefferson Avenue, you will stay in your left hand lane where you will see the sign to the Virginia Living Museum.

Directions to Tazewell Hall, home of Paige Lawson 1109 Riverside Drive (757)596-9695 • 3.9 Miles

Exiting the Omni take a left onto Diligence. At the Diligence stop light, you will take a right onto US 17S/J. Clyde Morris Blyd. Crossing Jefferson Avenue, stay straight on J. Clyde Morris. At the light (Riverside Hospital on your left) go straight as if you are going to The Mariners' Museum. Stay in the left lane and follow around to the traffic circle which takes you to Shoe Lane. Stav straight until you get to the 4way stop signs. Go straight onto Shoe Lane. You will see a sign that says Riverside Drive to your left. Stay straight and the Lawson's driveway is on your left hand side. A valet will assist from there. (Wear comfortable shoes and bring a wrap.)

Directions to The Mariners' Museum • 100 Museum Drive (757) 591-7736 • 1.3 Miles

Exiting the Omni take a left onto Diligence. At the Diligence stop light, you will take a right onto US 17S/J. Clyde Morris Blvd. Crossing Jefferson Avenue, stay straight on J. Clyde Morris. After you pass Riverside Hospital on your left, you will go straight through the light, bearing left into The Mariners' Museum entrance. Following signs to the museum, parking will be in front of the Peninsula Fine Arts Center.

Directions to CNU Performing Arts Center • 1.3 Miles

Exiting the Omni Hotel take a left onto Diligence. At the Diligence stop light, you will take a right onto US 17S/J. Clyde Morris Blvd. Crossing Jefferson Avenue, stay straight on J. Clyde Morris. After you pass Riverside Hospital on your left, you will go straight through the light. Get into the right lane, which will lead you to the CNU parking garage. Enter the garage on your right and signs will guide you to the Performing Arts Center.
