"No Shrinkin' Violet, She" Faye Cooper Receives deLacy Gray Memorial Medal

The deLacy Gray Memorial Medal for Conservation was presented at the Annual Meeting by Conservation and Beautification Committee Chairman, Hylah Boyd (Mrs. J.P. McGuire Boyd) to Lafayette (Faye) Crawford Cooper (Mrs. Peter F. Cooper) of the Augusta Garden Club.

In 1989, Faye founded the Valley Conservation Council which serves 11 counties in the Shenandoah Valley. The organization's purpose is to get citizens involved in selecting growth options which will provide long-term protection for the Valley's resources and to promote land use that will sustain the farms, forests, open spaces, and cultural heritage of the Valley of Virginia. She advocates two approaches: one, to promote private, voluntary land protection; and two, to encourage public policy to preserve the Shenandoah Valley's natural assets. One of the directors on her board says, "She has the kind of passion for our mission that makes success inevitable."
