hose who recognize this virtual addition to the latest native plant list know that Goran Ivanisevic is not the only winner to emerge from Croatia recently. This year's deLacy Gray Memorial Medal for Conservation was awarded to Fran Boninti (Mrs. Andrew F.)

A member of the Rivanna Garden Club, Fran has worked tirelessly as a volunteer to educate young and old on how to identify, safeguard, and propagate native plants. She has played a vital role in the School Tour Program of the Ivy Creek Foundation. In organizing the landscaping effort around the Education Building at The Ivy Creek Natural Area, she persuaded 16 nurseries to donate trees, shrubs and plants.

At the Holkham Hollow Natural Area, Fran spearheaded the successful effort to win a grant to develop natural areas on neighboring common lands and helped residents refine trails, build bridges and plant seedlings. She co-authored a guidebook to the area with

local history, maps and identification of flora and fauna.

In addition, Fran headed the committee that constructed a butterfly garden and bluebird trail for the Meriwether Lewis Elementary School.

With characteristic modesty, Fran says "a lot of people should have their names en-

graved along with mine on the medal." She credits the inspiration and guidance of her coworkers at the Ivy Creek Foundation with sending her down the path of environmental education. Her membership and participation in the Virginia Native Plant Society has influenced the zeal with which she promotes the virtues of our own indigenous flora.

The Garden Club of Virginia is fortunate to have Fran's generous vitality, her breadth of knowledge and her deep-rooted commitment to Virginia's native environment as a resource, as well as a treasure.
